






"EQUIPPING LEADERS, EMPOWERING YOUNGER GENERATIONS AND MULTIPLYING CHURCHES"

EXPERIENCING GOD'S JOY

We are here this week with our one year old daughter. She's learning new words pretty much every day, and it's lovely to hear what words she thinks are important. Just yesterday, she started saying "happy" over and over again. I was so encouraged because I've been worrying if she was actually having a good time here but I felt like God was just saying "It's ok, she's happy!" I'm so thankful that she can experience God's joy and happiness here, even when she's so small."

GOD HAS YOUR BACK

"I booked a session of pastoral prayer in the Network Venue for a bit of a clear out of some spiritual "clutter" around ministry. I had arrived in Shepton Mallet with a whiplash-like pain in my back that I had had for weeks. As I was being prayed for, the pain went away as the burdens I was carrying were also lifted! I hadn't asked for healing prayer but there it was - and what a relief! I said to the couple praying what had happened and one of them was just about to share a word "God has got your back"!"

SAVED MY FAITH

"I found myself at New Wine 24 by accident due to a change in circumstances and I wasn't looking forward to it. I felt this way as while I've been a fully paid up 'Charismatic' Christian for many years, events of the last 12 months have left us isolated, without a home church and me struggling to keep my faith. Walking onto site the first day felt hard, and I didn't stay long. But we came back the next day and the next - listening to Bishop Ruth I could feel the wisdom, the love and the sheer hard work she clearly invested - I leant new things and felt an intense longing to be back in the fold and take action. While I wasn't brave enough to seek prayer ministry, I can safely say that New Wine 24, and specifically Ruth has saved my faith."

BROUGHT UP FROM THE GRAVE

66 I arrived at New Wine very tired, physically and emotionally. I work in a church in interregnum and had just finished leading a busy holiday club. In addition I'm nursing my mum through end stage cancer so wasn't even sure if I'd be able to leave her to come to New Wine.

The lovely young person that prayed for me felt that God encouraged them to read to me Ezekiel 37 about the dried bones. Of course I'd heard it before but this time there was a new word that God spoke to me through in verse 12 '...I am going to open the graves and bring you up from them...'

I had a revelation that I had indeed, whilst caring for mum, been drawn into the grave with her sharing the pain of death and it had dragged me down.

After that it seemed that every song proclaimed Jesus conquering death and the grave having no hold. Hallelujah! Jesus has beaten death and has the victory. I knew that but needed to be reminded to live it out."

MET GOD IN POWERFUL WAYS

66 As a former full-time minister who has struggled with faith over the last few years, a large part of me was dreading coming to New Wine this year, overcome mostly by the nostalgia of being back in Shepton after so long.

I was not hopeful of getting anything out of this week and was concerned that it would kill off what little faith I had left.

Getting into the rhythm of attending the Chapel services each morning and receiving the Eucharist has been a life saver for me. I have been comforted, encouraged, challenged and have met God in powerful ways. **

PEACE CAME, I FEEL FREE

"My sadness and anger was growing and it was choking the sweet soft parts of me. The pain was becoming heavier to bear and I was beginning to see bitterness in my heart, and I was hardening it.

My friend urged me to get prayer. The lady who prayed with me happened to have also been in the medical profession. I felt understood and felt her empathy as she prayed.

Then the most incredible thing happened. She had a picture of a huge thorn. It was barbed and had wounded me. I could see it in my mind's eye. It was huge and penetrated deep into the pit of my

stomach. She asked God to remove it. As she prayed, I could see God take it out. Once and for all.

My soul cried out the deep pain I'd been carrying around in the hidden parts of my being. I wept and wept. I'm pretty sure I wailed in agony. But boy did God take it out. I was bent over with the weight of pain and sadness. And as she continued to pray, God took its weight off me. I could stand and receive his peace and healing. She and another lady then continued to pray for every thorn, every scar, every lie I'd been believing, to be removed. Peace came. I feel free. **

n recent years, Luminosity has gathered thousands of young people at New Wine Festivals. This past summer, there was a tangible sense that this generation is done with the emptiness the world has to offer. Instead, there is a deep longing to pursue Jesus and for God to heal their land. Revival is more than a word for this generation. They're chasing after it.

At the Festival one night, I noticed the café area was unusually empty. Where were the young people? They were pouring themselves into worshipping Jesus - pushing the curfew limit to the max, not wanting to leave His presence. "I love you Lord!" I heard one young person shout.

There was even a small protest at one of the less spiritual afterhours themes. Exhausted by the rubbish the world often offers, it was clear this generation wants pure Jesus!

othing prepares you for the sheer impact and power of walking into a venue full to the brim with 650 10-11 year-olds released in worship and singing with heartfelt praise. Some lost in wonder with their hands raised and eyes closed. Others clutching their hands to their chests and singing every word as though it were a matter of life or death. Still others, kneeling with faces lifted heavenwards. Each responding individually to God and each with such a depth and passion that is beautiful, awesome and humbling.

Boulder Gang (10-11 year-olds) started day one with the same fervour, passion and spiritual hunger with which it ended last year - and that is saying some-

thing! These young hearts were full of love for Jesus and an eager desire to press into all that God had in store for them - and what a lot there was!

With over 1,800 children on site, we praise God that over a third, 634, made a decision to follow Jesus! More than that, that every child was immersed in the often-tangible presence of God each and every day, and had the opportunity to go deeper with Him. Two year-olds sitting on a throne, spending time with 'King Jesus' (represented by a soft toy lion);

3-4 year-olds soaking in the peaceful presence of the Holy Spirit, 5-7 year-olds praying by chatting to God and waiting on Him (a technique known as 'chatting and catching'); 8-9 year-olds spontaneously praising Jesus for 15 minutes whilst the team were unable to move them onto their next activity; and 10-11 year-olds sharing words and pictures that helped others in their faith. he Accessible Church Ministry is an important and integral part of our summer Festival. Accessible Church exists to support those who attend with additional needs across all of the venues, as well as being supported to serve on team. In 2024, the Our Place team supported nearly 450 young people across the New Wine Kids and Luminosity venues. We love seeing inclusion modelled across all the venues and believe that everyone should be able to join in with what is going on.

We are also committed to supporting parents and carers of those with additional needs in our Breathe venue, and last summer we had over 120 parents choosing to attend each morning. One parent said: "It's not an exaggeration to say that Breathe allows me to cope with the whole year. Some-

thing about the love and care, the understanding and the integrity and the way God works through it, is AMAZING."

Each year we have a growing number of adults and young people reliant on support from our Accessible Church Ministry, and we can only do this through our amazing volunteers who give up their time.

uring 2024, New Wine Trust managed income and spending of over £4 million, with the Festival being the largest at around 85% of charitable spending.


In the summer, we returned to Shepton Mallet and enjoyed some wonderful weather, fantastic fellowship and heard some truly tremendous testimonies! Following changes in sites several times in recent years, New Wine is keen to stay at the Bath and West Showground and work with the management team to develop the facilities there.

At the end of the financial year, 31st December 2024, New Wine has almost bro-

ken even despite the summer Festival running at a loss. We give huge thanks for the generosity of the New Wine family and their giving in the offering that ensured we covered all our expenses.

ew Wine is a network of leaders and a family of churches, and we have been working hard over the last two years to reinvigorate the network and develop a new long-term strategy for equipping leaders more intentionally and consistently. As Rich Johnson says "Renewal of the local church is always unto something. We believe the Lord is saying to us that this is a season for fresh and confident apostolic mission for the sake of the world". For New Wine, our network is at the heart of making this a reality. A small 'Network Development Team' was established to work with the Leadership Team to develop this strategy and will be working with the newly appointed Strategic Director to further this.

Our annual Leadership Conference now gathers around 2000 leaders gathers from across the country and beyond. This is wonderful but we have recognised the need for more points of connection and equipping for leaders throughout the year. To that end we

have introduced Network Days in both the autumn and summer terms, designed to sit alongside and complement the annual Leadership Conference. Network Days are intended to be resourced nationally and run locally, meaning at each one there will be keynote speakers reflecting a theme across all the venues, as well as teaching delivered locally which speaks into the area and context. We ran the first three of these days in November 2024, each of the days were well received and have given us a solid foundation to build on for the next set of Network Days which will take place between 20th - 22nd May 2025.

Alongside the Leadership Conference and Network Days, we continue to run specific gatherings for our ministry streams, as well as a number of New Wine Celebrations hosted in local churches up and down the country. A key part of the network has for a long time been our Area Gatherings. These have always been places where leaders have been able to encounter God through transformational teaching, wor-

ship and ministry as well as a place to be in intentional and supportive relationship with others. A key focus for 2025 will be gathering, investing in and better supporting our Area Gatherings as we look to launch new ones and relaunch some that stopped meeting during Covid.

To support all this, two Network Administrators were appointed in 2023. Alice and Chrissie have been doing a fantastic job supporting our Heads of Ministry and helping to develop the work of our many and varied ministry streams, and we're very thankful for them!

We believe the network can have a significant role in resourcing leaders to bring transformation to local churches in every part of the country and are excited by all God can do in and through it in the years to come. Our aim has been to reinvigorate the Leadership Network and a core part of this is our Area Gatherings. Most Area Gatherings consist of meeting, eating, praying and worshipping together, with input from an invited guest speaker for reflection. These gatherings are a great way to support and pray for each other in local ministry, in between the national events where we gather as one network.

We conducted a survey of Area Gathering Leaders to find out which were currently active, and which were on pause. We now know that we have at least 20 active Area Gatherings in: Birmingham, Bristol, Buckinghamshire (High Wycombe), Cambridge, Croydon, Gloucestershire, Hereford, Hull and East Yorkshire, Lancashire, Leicestershire, Liverpool, North East London, North Essex, North Kent, North London, North Surrey, North Warwickshire, Northwood, Nottinghamshire, Peterborough, Poole, Salisbury, Scarborough & Ryedale, Shropshire, South

Hants, South Manchester, South Staffordshire & Black Country, South Surrey, St Albans, Luton & Chorleywood, Suffolk, West Kent, West London.

If your gathering isn't on this list, but you're currently active, please do let us know so we can direct local leaders to you when they join the Leadership Network – plus we love to hear stories of what God's doing in your area. If you're not currently linked into an Area Gathering, the Network team would love to help you get connected. They are on hand to do this at our Leadership Conference, Network Days, Summer Festival in the Network Venue or by email at networks@new-wine.org.

In 2024 our vision was to see the Leadership Network reinvigorated and reviewing the year, we can see so much more activity happening across our Ministry Streams and in local events for those in church leadership. Our heart is to see leaders across the nation equipped and empowered in Holy Spirit ministry, in order to see their local churches change the nation.

Our Leadership Network is made up of over 4500 leaders; these are not only Senior Church Leaders, but Youth and Children's leaders, Admin and Operations managers, Worship leaders and more. These leaders self-select their ministry interest 'streams' to receive relevant communications and information about activities in those streams. Senior Church Leaders are connected to their local Area Gatherings, which generally happen bi-monthly, locally hosted by Area Gathering Leaders. Historically, we have also had local groups for Worship Leaders and those in our Raising Generations ministry stream, and as part of our 'reinvigoration' plan, we hope that these groups may pick up again.

Recognising they can't do this alone, Jenny and Jonathan see New Wine as a vital source of help and support through the network. Their daughter Deborah even wrote a card saying:

St Thomas's is in the heart of Newcastle city centre, they have a vision for transforming the North East of England through the power of the Holy Spirit and they're witnessing a significant number of young people coming to faith. St Thomas's is a resource church supporting a New Wine church plant with an Eden team in the Byker Estate. Nathan, the Eden team young people. Eleven years ago, Emma felt called by God at the summer Festival to start a food bank in Bristol. Just as she was about to move there, her friends at New Wine commissioned her with a single tin of tuna - and off she went! Fast forward to today, and Bristol North West Food Bank is feeding 10,000 people a year, alongside many other initiatives like a Home Bank, Advice Workshops, Woodworking Skills, free courses, and more. They've seen both recipients and staff come to faith and get baptised, which has been incredibly exciting! This work is a true team effort, with volunteers, food, and finances all coming from over 30 local churches. Emma, now the Food Bank Manager, shared, "I can hardly believe this all started from a call from God at New Wine!"

ship. From unforgettable Worship Nights to releasing new resources and seeing growth in the Worship Leaders Network, God has been moving in powerful ways across the nation.

Going into 2024, I felt God stirring us to take New Wine Worship on the road, bringing the joy of worshipping together as thousands at the Festival into local church settings across the nation. Local churches are already doing incredible things, and we wanted to come alongside them - not just to celebrate what God is doing but to share the prophetic sense we've carried and create space for ministry in the power of the Holy Spirit.

We began the year with Worship Nights in Leeds, Manchester, Birmingham, London, and Bristol. These evenings were focused on Joshua 3:5: "Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do amazing things among you." They were beautiful gatherings of encounter, where hearts were purified, and eves were fixed on Jesus.

don. Each evening carried its own prophetic significance. In Scunthorpe, we waved a chequered flag as a declaration of commitment to God. In Kent. we leaned into hearing God's voice, creating sacred moments of listening and discernment. In London, we saw a powerful wave of prayer as many interceded passionately for their city, crying out for revival. What has been truly special across all eight Worship Nights is how each one was unique, reflecting what God was doing in that moment and region. Each guest we brought with us shared something different, and every night was really special.

It has also been an incredible year for releasing new resources to equip and inspire the Church. We launched the It Was You EP, featuring the song Peace Be With You, which continues to resonate deeply with people around the world. 

he New Wine Urban Stream is for church leaders serving in the places where life can be hardest, where money is scarcest and where the people and communities are often forsaken and under-resourced. It encompasses inner cities, estates, the margins, priority communities, Urban Priority Areas (UPA) - it's typically the 10% most deprived communities according to the Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD).

Over the last year our focus has been on helping urban church leaders bring groups to New Wine Festival through our bursary scheme and on making sure our IMPACT venue created an environment that enabled our urban communities to meet with God and be changed by him.

We were able to assist more than 30 churches in bringing groups to New Wine Festival 2024 through the generous bursary scheme.

IMPACT 2024 had a new home in Shepton Mallet in the Showering Pavilion and was our biggest ever IMPACT venue with over 1,500 seats. It also had the biggest screen on site!

Each morning we journeyed through Philippians with the legendary Matt Britton acting as the Apostle Paul writing to his beloved church from his prison cell and the Impact team taking us on a teaching journey through the letter.

We heard testimonies from all over the country of ministries in our urban communities led by people with changed lives now changing the lives of others.

We love to use creativity to respond to God and this year in IMPACT we had an incredible art area taking us through the valley.

ver the last few years the goal has been to support key 'planting hub' churches across the network who have planted 50 churches since 2019. The 2023-24 planter's training cohort supported 20 church planters, many of whom were commissioned from the stage at the 2024 Festival. This year we had 38 applications which has led to 19 church planters in the cohort.

In summer 2024 we began to speak about 'every one plant one', an initiative to encourage every church of every size to think about how they might plant, pioneer or graft something new in the power of the Spirit for the sake of those who don't yet know Jesus.

n 2024 the New Wine Discipleship Year (NWDY) saw 71 students across nine hubs step into a deeper relationship with God and a greater understanding of His purpose for their lives. NWDY is a dynamic programme equipping students to live as disciples through the Word, by the Spirit, for the Kingdom. Here are some stories from the DY residential (4-6 November).

"I came hoping to encounter God again. The first two days were difficult - I struggled with worship and even felt the need to leave the room when it started, only coming back in for the talks. But in the last session, I felt a strong pull to stay. I decided to remain through worship and, during that time, I felt a powerful connection with God, like I did last September. I sat, prayed, and cried, feeling deeply touched by the Holy Spirit.

This experience has left me feeling hopeful and excited to see how God will work in this renewed relationship I have with Him. I'm looking forward to seeing where He leads me and how He will use me in the lives of others."

Nick's story reflects what NWDY is all about - discipleship that fosters personal renewal and equips students to minister to others.

Another student shared a story of freedom from anxiety, which they've struggled with for many years. "This week I realised that God was still with me and helping and healing me not just once but continuously and felt a massive weight lifted and handing it all to God and my anxiety getting weaker and weaker."

These moments of healing and restoration are hallmarks of DY, where students are encouraged to walk closely with God and experience His transformative power in every area of their lives.

The vision of the Discipleship Year is rooted in enabling students to grow in their faith, character, and ministry skills, so they can serve their local churches and, in turn, bring transformation to the world. Through teaching, practical placements, and residentials where we place ourselves under the authority of God's word, we seek to raise up young leaders serving in local churches changing nations.

As students dive deeper into scripture, learn to listen to the Spirit, and serve others, they are prepared not just to lead, but to inspire others to live for the Kingdom.

DISCIPLESHIP YEAR MINISTRY LEAD NEW WINE



upported by the Church of England's Innovation Fund, The Raising Generations Minster Pilot is an initiative designed to explore innovative ways to support churches with little or no youth or children's ministry in starting, growing, and sustaining these vital ministries.

The pilot partners with nine large New Wine churches that already have established and flourishing youth and children's ministries. Each of these churches is working with at least two smaller churches in their local area that currently lack structured youth and/ or children's work. By providing practical support, training, and facilitating collaborative events, these 'minsters' aim to create a supportive framework or 'scaffolding' that empowers smaller churches to establish and grow their own regular discipling communities.

Now at the halfway point of its three-year pilot, the project is actively partnering with 29 smaller churches and engaging more than 40 volunteers to make this vision a reality.

"Being part of the Raising Generations Minster has been fantastic. It has enabled me to look at the area around my church and dream for young people I would never have the time or capacity to meet. Instead, the project means

my church supports me to use some of my time to build relationships other churches. One of our minster churches has so far gone from no children to 12 on a Sunday morning. Another just held their first seeker-friendly service and saw their normal attendance go from 10 people with no children to 50 adults and 15 children! It is not the numbers, however, that are exciting. It is building relationship with other Christians, praying together for our area and building something sustainable that means everyone will have the opportunity to explore faith and meet Jesus for themselves. It is great to share the joys and challenges with one another and learn together what works. I can't wait to see what else God has in store" - Sarah Morton, Emmanuel Church, Stoughton.

ast year was the first full year that Jonathan and I have been ministry leads for the Leaders in Training (LiT) part of the New Wine Leadership Network. When we took on our roles there was a need to rebuild and revision what the LiT Network was and could be following the impact of the pandemic and with a cohort

of people that shifts each year. LiT includes people who are just beginning the process of discerning a call to church leadership through to those who are completing their first training post.

As we prayed and planned together we were reminded of Elijah in the cave (1 Kings 19) when he retreated to the cave and met with God's presence. Having both recently finished our church leadership training, we were aware of the various demands on leaders in training and also sometimes the gap of prayer ministry and connection with others who speak the same church language! On the back of this, we developed our sense of vision for LiT in the coming season:

New Wine Leaders in Training is a space to connect with others training for church leadership in the New Wine family. A space to be prayed for and pray with others. A space to be equipped by those further on in the journey.

In 2024 we had two in person meet-ups, one at the New Wine Leadership Conference in February and one at the Summer Festival. On both occasions we were able to connect with new people and begin to share our vision for LiT as part of the New Wine Network. We were particularly encouraged that we connected with 45 leaders in training at the Summer Festival meet-up, when the previ-

ous summer we had only connected with 12 people. We were also able to have a number of 1-to-1 longer conversations with people at the Festival to pray and help process their call to leadership.

We have also held three online LiT Gatherings with input from people from the New Wine family on leadership topics less likely to be included in formal denominational training but are core New Wine values. Paul Harcourt gave insight on leading prayer ministry times and how to cultivate a culture of prayer ministry in all kinds of church contexts. Gareth Robinson led on church multiplication and how we can both be a part of it and encourage it in the places where we lead. These online gatherings have had varying numbers in attendance and we are working on ways to increasingly get the message out so that more people are able to access them.

Looking ahead we are planning to follow a similar pattern of in-person meet-ups at the Leadership Conference and Summer Festival and online LiT Gatherings quarterly. We are also exploring ways that we might be able to better connect with theological colleges.
